# Police Department – Sworn

- 115 Authorized positions
  - 95 of those positions are filled
  - 44 of those 95 positions are in service
  - 31 officers are assigned to patrol
    - Averaging over 100 calls a shift
    - Modified work schedule
  - 7 officers are assigned to investigations
    - Those 7 averaging a case load of just over 300 cases
    - 7 detectives are doing all filling and follow up

# Police Department – Non-Sworn

- Animal Services
  - 18 positions in the unit
  - Between full time and part time staff, 5 vacancies
    - 2 Part time openings
    - 2 full time openings
    - 1 Animal Control Officer Opening
- Functions
  - 25 walk in's daily
  - 8 surgeries per day
  - 10-20 ACO calls per shift
  - 80-160 Animals in the shelter at a given time

# Police Department – Non-Sworn cont'd

- Records
  - Authorized 10 full time positions
    - 1 supervisor position
    - 2 leads & 7 regular positions
      - 4 part time positions
- Functions
  - Logging warrants
  - CLETS / NCIC entry
  - Adhere to records retention for all documents
  - Process citations
  - MP Entries
  - Online reporting management
  - Process DA updates
  - Crime lab data entry
  - Manage public records request
  - Cover the front counter
  - Non-emergency phone coverage

# Police Department – Non-Sworn cont'd

- Community Service Officers (CSOs)
  - Authorized 11 fulltime positions, no vacancies
- Functions
  - Jail operations
  - Prisoner transport
  - Report Writing
  - Legal Registrations
  - Manage property section
  - Support patrol / investigations


# Police Department – Non-Sworn cont'd

- Police Dispatch
  - 1 supervisor
  - 4 leads
  - 8 dispatchers with 3 vacancies
- Functions
  - Answer all calls emergency and non-emergency
    - Fire
    - Medical
    - CHP
    - Sheriffs Office
  - Dispatch for officers, AQCRT, code and parking enforcement, transfer fire/medical calls to ConFire
  - Update data into CAD
  - After hours Public Works notifications

*\*In December 2021, APD transitioned to from UCR to the NIBRS method of crime stat reporting. Some of the impacts of this change include allowing for multiple crime types to be associated with one incident and the conversion of robbery from a person crime to a property crime. Therefore, comparing historical UCR data to NIBRS data should have these changes taken into consideration. Additionally, the 2022 crime stat data is based on unaudited RMS data at the time of report generation and is subject to change.*
