Dear Sir:

I would like to request the investigation of Mr. Jeffrey Belle for violation of California Election Code 18203:

"Any person who files or submits for filing a nomination paper or declaration of candidacy knowing that it or any part of it has been made falsely is punishable by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code for 16 months or two or three years or by both that fine and imprisonment."

Apparently, Mr. Belle knowingly provided false information in his declaration of candidacy filed with the Election Office on August 6, 2014, in an effort to maliciously influence the election result for the position of Area 5 Trustee of the Contra Costa County Board of Education.

Mr. Belle made false claims in his candidate statement which appeared in voter information pamphlet (A), distributed to approximately 88,000 eligible voters of Area 5. Mr. Belle also made false claims in his ballot designation worksheet (B) to gain the designation of "Educator", based on training of students and health care practitioners in respiratory therapy.

Information verified by journalist Matthias Gafni printed in the Contra Costa Times on October 17, 2014 (C) repudiated Mr. Belle's claims, to wit:

VOTER PAMPHLET: *"I owned ... an institute for training students in health care ... a Registered Respiratory Therapist."* (A)

BALLOT WORKSHEET: *"I trained respiratory therapy students by lecturing and tutoring them as well as other health care practitioners"* (B-2)

CCTIMES: *"The investigator informed Belle he was illegally representing himself as a practitioner and Belle signed an affidavit saying he would no longer do so, according to the report"* (C-2)
" ... On June 20, the state board cited Belle for "misrepresenting himself as a respiratory care practitioner and engaging in the practice of respiratory care without a current and valid license in California." He was fined \$8,200 ... Belle has not paid the fine" (C-3)

On June 20, 2014, the Respiratory Care Board of California issued a citation order (D) stating:

"On March 14, 2011, Subject ... acknowledging he understood the following: ... "No person shall engage in the practice of respiratory care or represent him/herself as such through verbal claim, sign advertisement, letterhead, business card, badge/name tag, or other representation unless he or she holds a valid license issued by the Board." JEFFERY JOHURA BELLE was and is not licensed to practice respiratory care in the State of California nor was he ever issued a work permit." (D-2 - D-3)

"JEFFERY JOHURA BELLE shall immediately cease and desist any and all unlicensed activities pursuant to the Respiratory Care Act." (D-3)

"JEFFERY JOHURA BELLE shall pay civil penalties in the amount of \$8,200 imposed for a violation of Business and Professions Code section 3760 (a) and (c) and 3761 subdivision (a) by misrepresenting himself as a respiratory care practitioner and engaging in the practice of respiratory care in California without a valid license. JEFFERY JOHURA BELLE shall pay the assessed \$8,200 civil penalty to the Board." (D-3)

Mr. Belle signed and understood the order made by the Respiratory Care Board of California not to practice respiratory therapy, nor represent himself in any manner, shape or form as a respiratory therapist. Yet, he claimed to 88,000 voters that he was a "Registered Respiratory Therapist" (A) and that he trained students and health care practitioners in respiratory therapy. (B-2)

VOTER PAMPHLET: *"... Bachelor's degree in Political Science" (A)*

CCTIMES: *"... claiming he had a bachelor's degree from American University in Washington, D.C. ... It appears Belle has no college degree. An American University registrar said Belle spent only one semester at the school and did not graduate." (C-2)*

VOTER PAMPHLET: *"I'm completing a Master of Public Administration (MPA) degree in Health Policy" (A)*

CCTIMES: *"... claiming ... a master's degree from Oklahoma City University ... An Oklahoma City University spokesman said Belle studied there but received no degree." (C-2)*

Oklahoma City University does not offer a Master of Public Administration degree. (E-1) Even if it did, Mr. Belle would not qualify as "Admission to Oklahoma City University's master's degree programs is open to all students holding bachelor's degrees". (E-2)

Mr. Belle's action is deliberate, calculated and not due to negligence. He has repeatedly submitted false credentials to other government agencies (switching schools and courses at different times) to obtain appointments to boost his profile in the voter information pamphlet.

VOTER PAMPHLET: *"on the County's Transit Authority Advisory Committee"*

Mr. Belle's application for appointment as representative to the County Transit Authority Advisory Committee falsely claimed he has the following educational credentials (F-2):

*MPA - Master of Public Administration (2014) Grand Canyon University
Certificate in Public Health (Johns Hopkins University)
B.S. - Political Science (Oklahoma City University / American University)*

The admission requirement for Master of Public Administration at Grand Canyon University is a *"DEGREE BEARING TRANSCRIPT - An undergraduate degree from an accredited, GCU-approved college, university ..."*. (G)

Johns Hopkins School of Public Health does not offer a Certificate in Public Health for non-degree Hopkins students. (H-1) Even if it did, Mr. Belle is not eligible since *"ELIGIBILITY - The Certificate is open to non-JHSPH students with at least a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university ..."*. (H-2)

VOTER PAMPHLET: *"... Emergency Medical Care Committee"*

Mr. Belle's application for appointment as representative to the Emergency Medical Care Committee falsely claimed in his resume that he has the following educational credentials (I-4):

*University of Penn, Certificate, Health Policy and Affordable Care Act
Stanford University, Certificate, Critical Writing in the Sciences
Johns Hopkins University, Certificate, Changes in Community Health*

The University of Penn does not offer a Certificate in Health Policy and Affordable Care Act. (J)


Stanford University does not offer a Certificate in Critical Writing in the Sciences. (K-1 and K-2) Even if it did, Mr. Belle does not meet the requirement of "a conferred Bachelor's degree. (K-3)

Mr. Belle is not eligible for a certificate program at Johns Hopkins; aside from the fact that Johns Hopkins does not offer a Certificate in Changes in Community Health. (H-1)

Mr. Belle knew, or should have known, at the time he signed his declaration of candidacy, the consequence of providing fake educational credentials in election documents. His criminal action is made even more egregious as Mr. Belle aspires to a position of Trustee in an educational agency. Mr. Belle has made a mockery of the election process and should be charged with a felony punishable with the maximum penalty allowed by law of \$1000 fine and 3 years imprisonment.

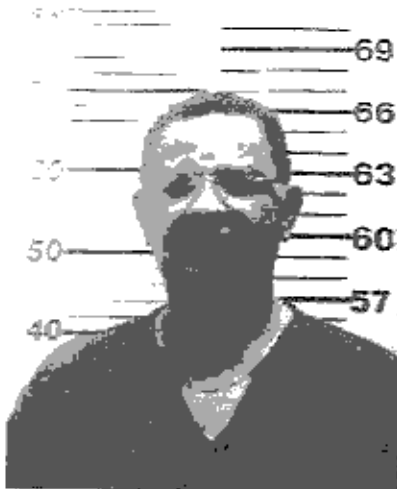

Antioch: Contra Costa school board candidate has criminal past, questionable background claims

ANTIOCH -- What appeared to be a routine race for one of three Contra Costa Board of Education seats has taken an absurd turn as revelations surface into the criminal, educational and medical background of candidate Jeffery Belle.

In June, a state agency cited and fined Belle, who has long lectured about nicotine addiction on the medical college circuit, for practicing respiratory care without a license. It was the latest in a string of criminal convictions, civil judgments, false education claims and fraud allegations discovered in an investigation by this newspaper.

Alerted to media inquiries about his past, Belle went on the attack, sending a threatening note Wednesday from his campaign e-mail address to his opponent Cynthia Teves Ruehlig and her husband Walter Ruehlig, a past Antioch school board member who is running for a third term.

"You are getting ready to see a frontal assault like you have not seen since Reagan and Carter in 1980," Belle wrote in an Oct. 15 e-mail to Walter Ruehlig obtained by this newspaper. "God is with me and He has made me a fortified City, an Iron Pillar and Bronze Walls. Brace up, my friend -- you just crossed the line and entered into 'Big League' politics."

The Ruehligs said they were not the source of negative information about Belle.

In 1992 and 1997, while living in Oklahoma, Belle was charged with felony bogus check cashing, pleading guilty in one case, according to court records. A warrant was issued for his arrest, but he wasn't caught until Santa Fe Police arrested him on New Year's Eve 2007, a police spokeswoman from the New Mexico department said.

He also was charged with a similar misdemeanor cashing bogus checks in Marion County, Florida, in 2000.

Belle has had more than 10 civil judgments totaling more than \$10,000 filed against him in Oklahoma and California, and federal and state tax liens from his time in Oklahoma.

With his voice raised, a combative Belle defended his record when asked to explain his criminal background and questions about his education.

"My past doesn't define me. Only Christ defines me. I'm not that same person," the 57-year-old Antioch resident said, adding he was speaking from the VA Hospital in Martinez where he does respiratory work. "I'm a trusted leader, one of the best educators and a consensus builder."

As to the bogus checks, Belle said he's learned his lesson.

"It's a true deal and I admit it," Belle said. "As a matter of fact, I don't write checks any more."

The person leading the charge to expose Belle is his ex-wife, Casey Jones.

Belle met Jones in 2007 and the pair married in New Mexico. Jones claims Belle ran up a \$35,000 credit card bill and left her nearly homeless when they divorced after only a few months.

"He went to church three times a week, prayed before each meal ..., " Jones said. "He was the epitome of a wonderful, wonderful man and I was lonely."

Following the experience, the 62-year-old Clovis, New Mexico, resident created the group "Women Against Con Men."

"He's smart enough to go just under the radar," she said.

Belle calls Jones a bitter ex-wife, saying her website is: "All revenge. It's all vitriol."

During a nomadic life across the country, Belle lectured at medical schools, libraries and other venues on the topic of respiratory care, claiming he had a bachelor's degree from American University in Washington, D.C., a master's degree from Oklahoma City University and a doctoral degree from Harrington University in London, switching details around at different times, according to documents. He said he had a bachelor's degree on his official statement appearing on Contra Costa County election material, as well as his campaign literature.

However, it appears Belle has no college degree. An American University registrar said Belle spent only one semester at the school and did not graduate. An Oklahoma City University spokesman said Belle studied there but received no degree. And Harrington is a well-documented diploma mill where students can pay hundreds of dollars to get a degree based on "life experience."

"I didn't know it was a diploma mill and once I did I stopped using (the doctor title)," Belle

said of Harrington. He also said he would have received his degree from Oklahoma City University if he had paid a final fee. However, a school official said he only accumulated 104 hours and, according to the school's website, a minimum of 124 hours is needed to graduate.

Belle said he's close to getting his master's degree from American Public University, an online college based in West Virginia.

Academics aside, Belle opened the Respiratory Clinical Institute in Pleasant Hill, which provided tutorial and clinical rotation services to students who were completing their respiratory care studies using an online program, according to state regulators.

In December 2010, Belle applied for a license with the Respiratory Care Board of California. On March 2, 2012, a state investigator interviewed Belle, who was wearing a white lab coat, a stethoscope and a name badge that identified him as a respiratory care practitioner, according to state records obtained through a public records request. Belle introduced himself as a practitioner and provided brochures that identified him with that title as well. The investigator informed Belle he was illegally representing himself as a practitioner and Belle signed an affidavit saying he would no longer do so, according to the report.

Two years later, on May 23, after failing to complete the application process, Belle's license application was abandoned. On June 20, the state board cited Belle for "misrepresenting himself as a respiratory care practitioner and engaging in the practice of respiratory care without a current and valid license in California." He was fined \$8,200.

Belle has not paid the fine, but appealed to receive a hearing before an administrative law judge.

"The state is trying to overtrump federal law," he said, adding that he successfully trained his students. Belle pointed to his credential with the National Board for Respiratory Care, which is active; however, the California branch said Belle is an "applicant," but does not have a state license to practice respiratory therapy.

In 2009, Belle's landlord evicted him from his Pleasant Hill institute offices for failure to pay \$3,400 in rent, according to court records. In 2010, Belle and his wife were evicted from a Walnut Creek address for failure to pay \$2,500 in rent.

Belle has appeared in photo opportunities with the likes of Gov. Jerry Brown, Attorney General Kamala Harris, former San Francisco Mayor Willie Brown and state Assembly minority Whip Connie Conway.

He serves on the Contra Costa Tobacco Prevention Coalition, the Contra Costa Transportation Authority's citizens advisory committee, and the Contra Costa Emergency Medical Services advisory committee.

Belle calls himself a "master campaign strategist" and said he expects to win the seat.

"As a proven educator, leader and consensus builder," Belle writes on his campaign website, "if you give me one percent of your trust, I will earn the other 99 percent."

Subject.

Administrative Citation Order No. C-14-0039 is hereby issued to JEFFERY JOHURA BELLE, at [Redacted] Antioch, California, 94531, in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 3766, subdivision (a), for violations of Business and Professions Code section 3760, subdivisions (a) and (c) and 3761, subdivision (a), by misrepresenting himself as a respiratory care practitioner and engaging in the practice of respiratory care without a current and valid license in California.

JURISDICTION

Business and Professions Code section 3710 states:

"The Respiratory Care Board of California, hereafter referred to as the board, shall enforce and administer this chapter [Chapter 8.3, the Respiratory Care Practice Act]."

Business and Professions Code section 3760, subdivision (a) states:

"Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, no person shall engage in the practice of respiratory care, respiratory therapy, or inhalation therapy. For purposes of this section, engaging in the practice of respiratory care includes, but is not limited to, representations by a person whether through verbal claim, sign, advertisement, letterhead, business card, or other representation that he or she is able to perform any respiratory care service, or performance of any respiratory care service."

Business and Professions Code section 3760, subdivision (c) states:

"...no person shall represent himself or herself to be a respiratory care practitioner, a respiratory therapist, a respiratory care technician, or an inhalation therapist, or use the abbreviation or letters "R.C.P.," "R.P.," or "I.T." or use any modifications or derivatives of those abbreviations or letters without a current and valid license issued under this chapter."

Business and Professions Code section 3761, subdivision (a) states:

"No person may practice respiratory care or represent himself or herself to be a respiratory care practitioner in this state, without a valid license granted under this chapter, except as otherwise provided in this chapter."

Business and Professions Code section 3766, subdivision (a) states:

"The board may issue a citation containing an order of abatement and civil penalties against a person who acts in the capacity of, or engages in the business of, a respiratory care practitioner in this state without having a license in good standing issued pursuant to this chapter."

Business and Professions Code section 3767, subdivision (a) states in part:

"The board shall issue a citation to a person and to his or her employer or contractor, if, upon inspection or investigation, either upon complaint or otherwise, the following conditions are met: (1) The board has probable cause to believe that the person is acting in the capacity of, or engaging in the practice of, a respiratory care practitioner in this state without having a license in good standing issued pursuant to this chapter."

Business and Professions Code section 3767, subdivision (b)(2) states:

"Each citation issued pursuant to subdivision (a) shall meet the following requirements: ... (2) Contain an order of abatement and an assessment of a civil penalty in an amount not less than two hundred dollars (\$200) nor more than fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000)."

Business and Professions Code section 3767, subdivision (g) states:

"The sanctions authorized under this section shall be separate from and in addition to, any other civil or criminal remedies."

California Code of Regulations section 1399.381, subsection (b)(4) states:

"(b) The methodology for assessing fine amounts shall be for each inspection or investigation made with respect to the violation, except as provided below: ... (4) The assessment of fine amounts for a violation of section 3750(c), 3760, 3761(a), or 3761(b) of the B&P or section 1399.360 of these regulations, shall be based upon each person who acts in the capacity of, or engages in the business of, or represents themselves as, a respiratory care practitioner, at each facility or location."

CAUSE FOR CITATION

On December 24, 2010, JEFFERY JOHURA BELLE (Subject), applied for licensure as a respiratory care practitioner in the State of California. On March 14, 2011, Subject completed the Board's Statement of Understanding acknowledging he understood the following:

"During the application period, the applicant shall be identified as a 'Respiratory Care Practitioner Applicant' and may only practice with a valid work permit while under the direct and immediate supervision of a licensed respiratory care practitioner."

"No person who has not been licensed by the Board shall engage in the practice of respiratory care despite holding a CRT or RRT credential."

"No person shall engage in the practice of respiratory care or represent him/herself as such through verbal claim, sign advertisement, letterhead, business card, badge/name tag, or other representation unless he or she holds a valid license issued by the Board."

JEFFERY JOHURA BELLE was and is not licensed to practice respiratory care in the State of

California nor was he ever issued a work permit. On May 23, 2014, Subject's application for licensure was deemed abandoned as he failed to complete the application process.

The California Medical Board conducted an investigation on the Subject and subsequently forwarded their findings to the Respiratory Care Board of California. The investigative report provided that the Subject was owner and Chief Executive Officer of the business, Respiratory Clinical Institute (RCI), which provided tutorial and clinical rotation services to students who were completing their respiratory care studies using an online program. On March 2, 2012, the Subject appeared for an interview with the Medical Board Investigator wearing a white lab coat, a name badge and a stethoscope. During the interview, the Subject introduced himself as Jeffery Belle, Respiratory Care Practitioner. On the lab coat was an embroidered patch and name badge that identified the Subject as "RCP." Subject also provided his advertising and contract/student materials to the investigator. Within the signature block of the Tutorial Agreement between RCI and the Student, the Subject is identified as an "RCP."

During the interview, the Medical Board Investigator informed the Subject that he was illegally representing himself as a respiratory care practitioner and again educated the Subject with the laws that govern the practice of respiratory care in the State of California. Subject signed an affidavit on March 30, 2012, stating he would no longer represent himself as a respiratory care practitioner in California.

The Subject engaged in the practice of respiratory care by representing himself as a respiratory care practitioner without a current and valid respiratory care practitioner license in California in violation of Business and Professions Code section 3760, subdivisions (a) and (c) and 3761, subdivision (a).

ORDER

JEFFERY JOHURA BELLE shall immediately cease and desist any and all unlicensed activities pursuant to the Respiratory Care Practice Act.

JEFFERY JOHURA BELLE shall pay civil penalties in the amount of \$8,200 imposed for a violation of Business and Professions Code section 3760 subdivisions (a) and (c) and 3761 subdivision (a) by misrepresenting himself as a respiratory care practitioner and engaging in the practice of respiratory care in California without a valid license. JEFFERY JOHURA BELLE shall pay the assessed \$8,200 civil penalty to the Board.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the Training Certificate the individual will be able to:

- Use appropriate statistical methods for critical reading of reports of statistical analysis of public health problems;
- Apply the basic concepts of epidemiology to the study of the patterns of disease and injury applied to public health;

ELIGIBILITY

The Certificate is open to non-JHSPPH students with at least a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university with at least one college level Biology course and one college level Math or Statistics course completed with a grade of B or above, and a strong overall record of successful academic performance.

The Training Certificate is also open to members of the public health workforce or students enrolled in graduate degree programs in other Johns Hopkins schools seeking formal education and training in the five core areas of public health. The program is intended to be taken on a part-time basis. The Certificate can be completed by taking all courses online or a combination of online and onsite courses.

Individuals who are matriculated in a degree program in the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School are not eligible for this Training Certificate.

Certificates

The certificate curricula at Penn are designed by faculty members to guide students in a thorough exploration of a particular topic. Students have the opportunity to earn certificates in a variety of subjects. Each certificate program has been created to direct and recognize students' learning and discovery in the interdisciplinary subject areas listed below.

You may choose to participate in a certificate program for several reasons. First, the program offers a roadmap for study, indicating which courses to take to gain more expertise on the topic in which you are interested. Second, the certificate appears on your transcript, and clearly announces your academic interest and expertise in this topic for potential employers or educational institutions. Finally, when pursuing a certificate, you are allowed to take up to five courses in a single department. If you do not participate in a certificate program, you are only allowed four courses within any one department while completing your MLA.

You can earn a certificate in a topic different from your MLA concentration. Both your MLA concentration and your certificate will be listed on your transcript.






